

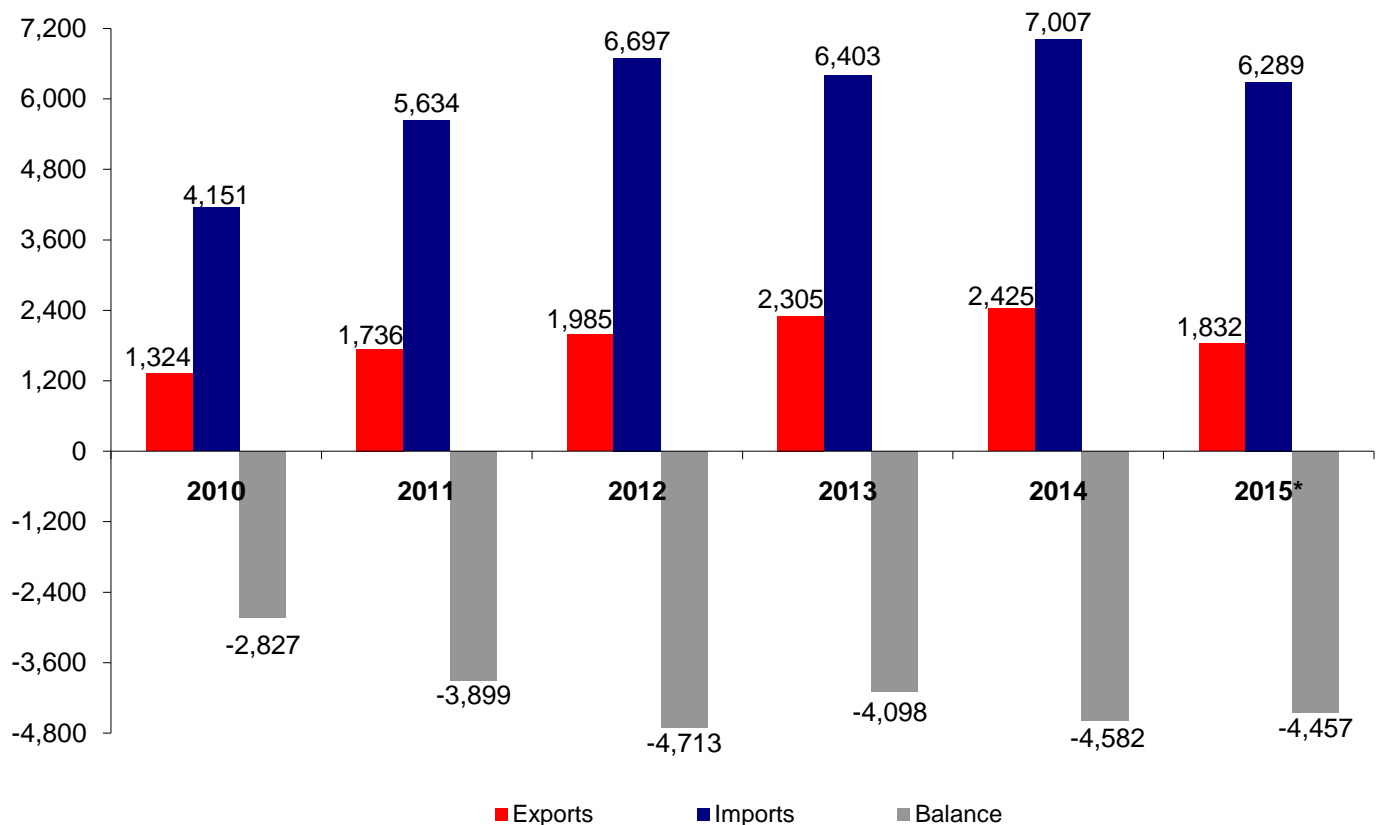

## External Trade of Georgia in January-October 2015 (Preliminary)

In January-October of 2015 external merchandise trade (excluding non-organized trade) in Georgia amounted to USD 8121 million, 14 percent decreased year-on-year. The exports equaled USD 1832 million (24 percent lower), while the imports stood at USD 6289 million (10 percent lower). The negative trade balance was USD 4457 million in January-October of 2015 and its share in external trade turnover constituted 55 percent.

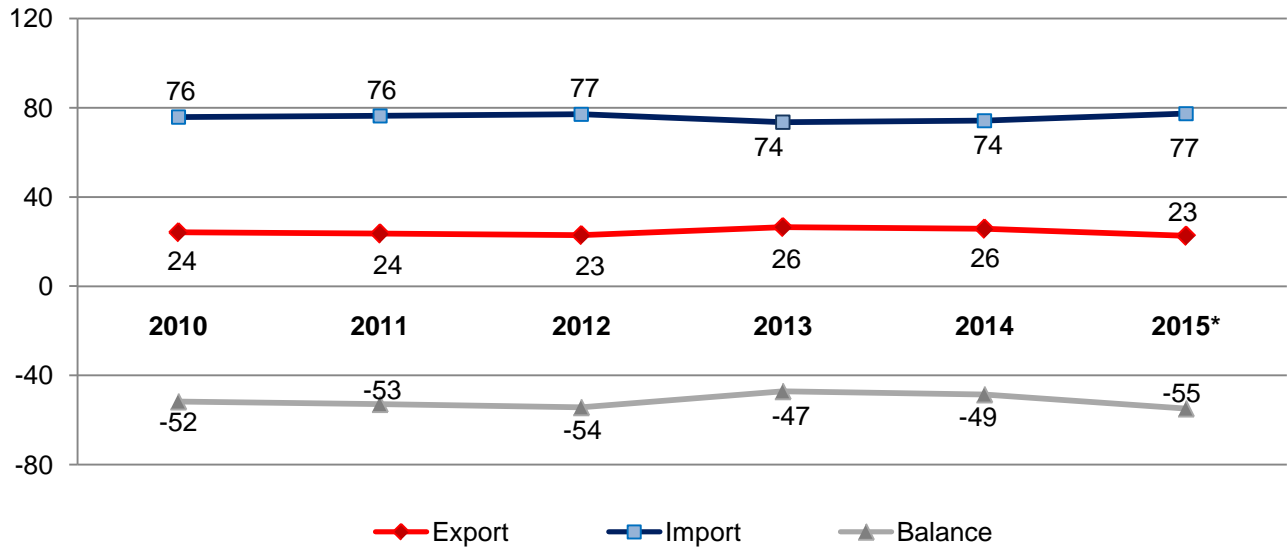

(Million US Dollars)**



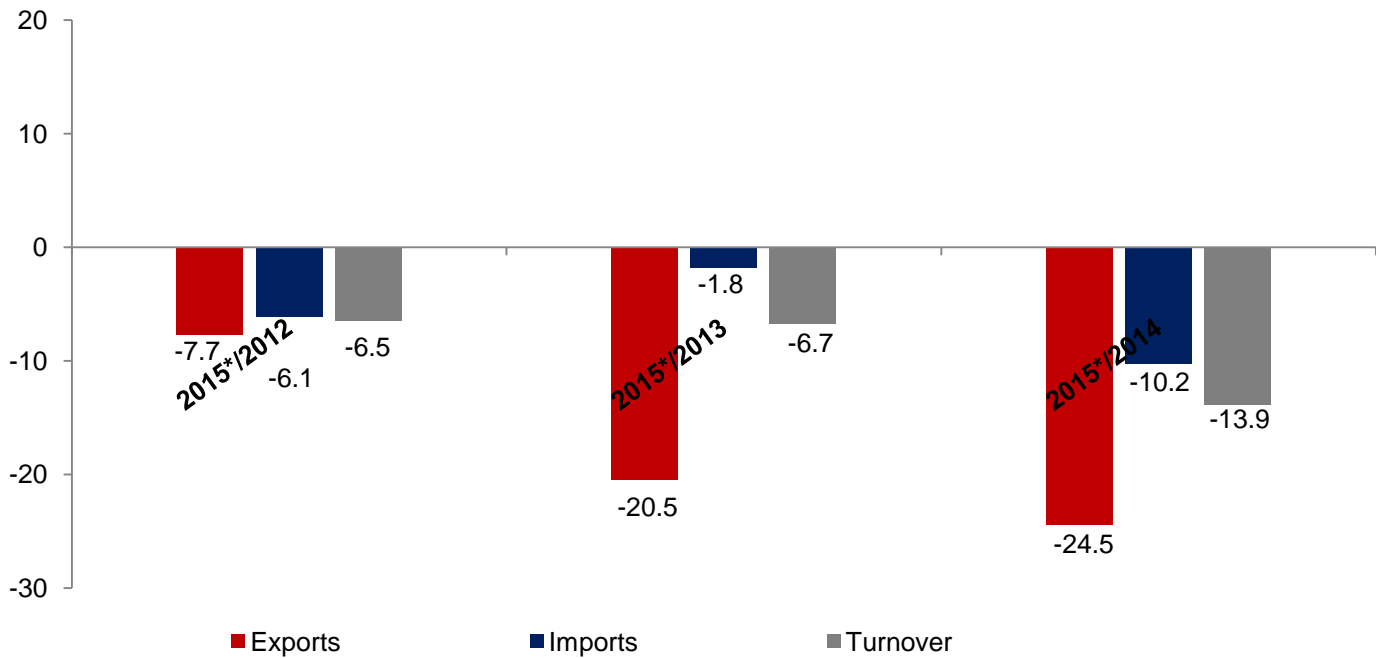

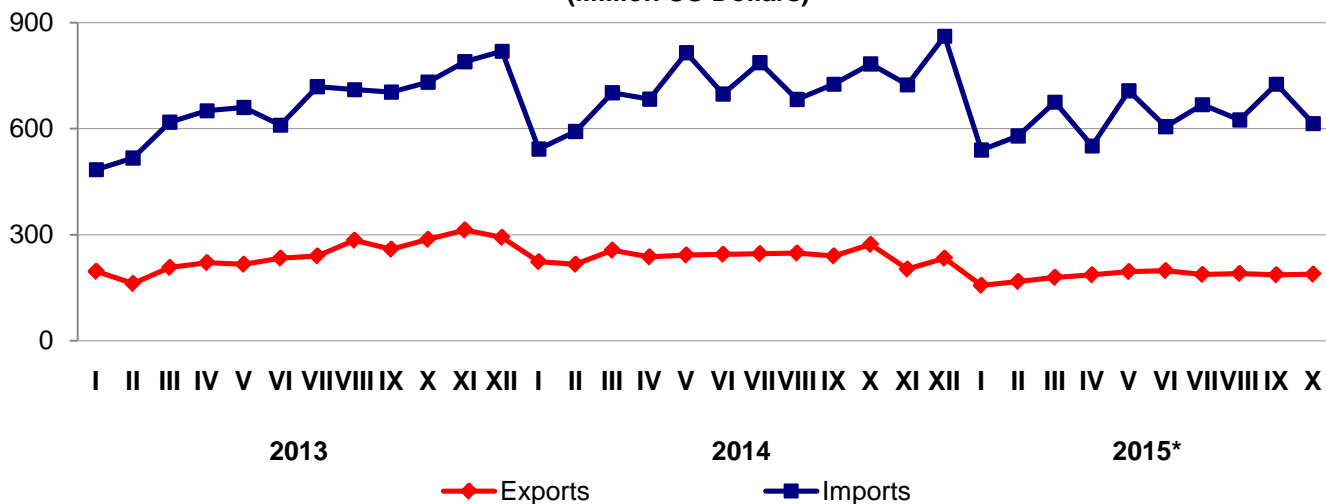

(Million US Dollars)

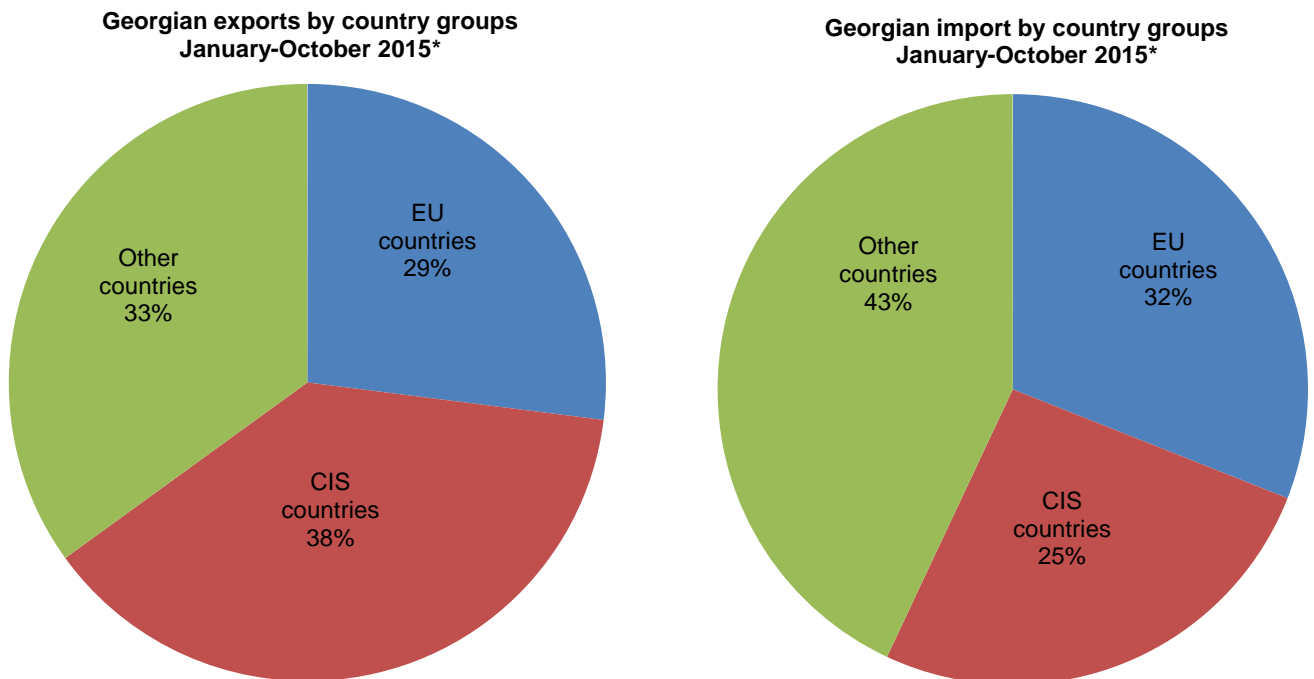

In January-October 2015 the external trade of Georgia with the EU countries amounted to USD 2568 million, up by 4 percent compared to the corresponding indicator of the previous year. Exports amounted to USD 537 million (2 percent higher), while imports amounted to USD 2031 million (4 percent higher). The share of these countries in the external trade of Georgia amounted to 32 percent, 29 percent in exports and 32 percent in imports (in January-October 2014 26, 22 and 28 percent correspondingly). 34 percent of the trade deficit came to the EU countries (31 percent in January-October 2014).

In January-October 2015 the external trade of Georgia with the CIS countries totaled USD 2261 million (lower by 23 percent compared to January-October 2014). Exports stood at USD 703 million (44 percent lower), while imports equaled USD 1559 million (8 percent lower). The share of the CIS countries in the external trade of Georgia constituted 28 percent, 38 percent in exports and 25 percent in imports (In January-October 2014 31, 52 and 24 percent, respectively). In January-October 2015, compared to the corresponding period of the previous year, CIS countries accounted for 19 percent of the overall trade deficit (9 percent in January-October 2014).

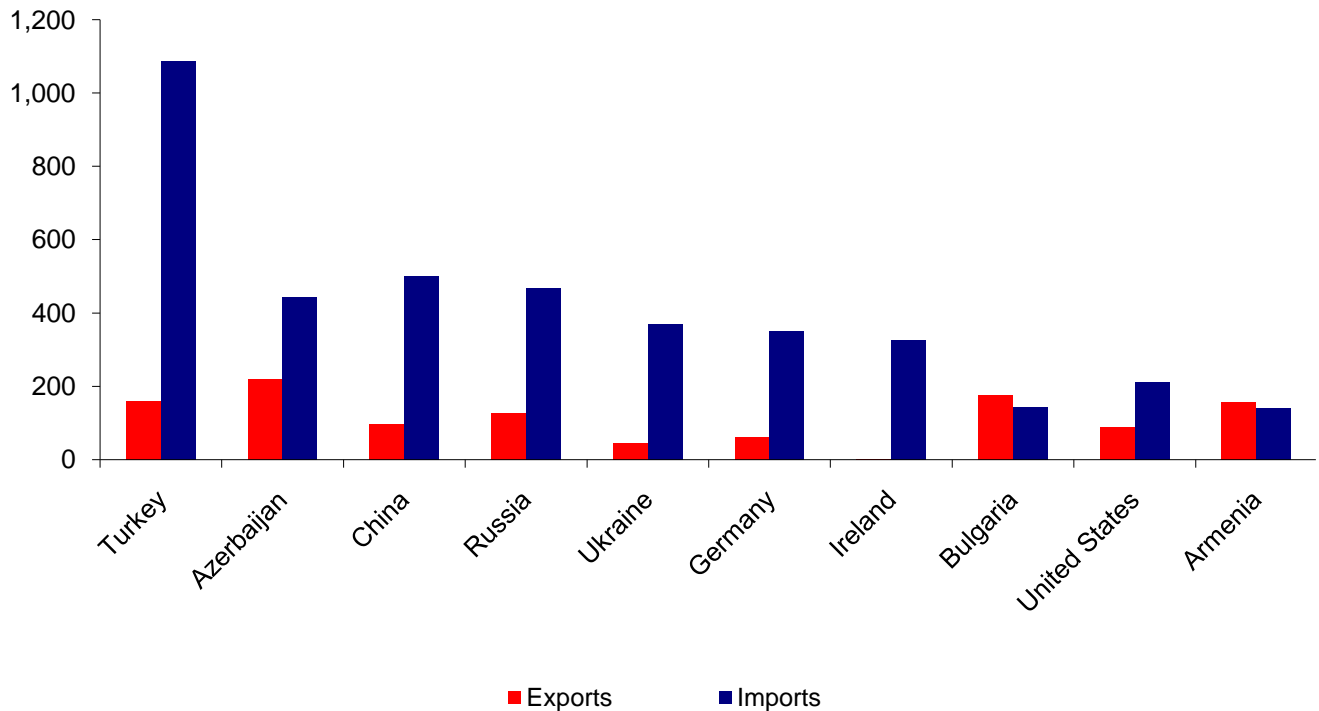
In January-October 2015 share of the top ten trading partners in the total external trade turnover of Georgia amounted to 64 percent. The top trading partners were Turkey (USD 1246 million), Azerbaijan (USD 664 million) and China (USD 596 million).

(Million US Dollars)**



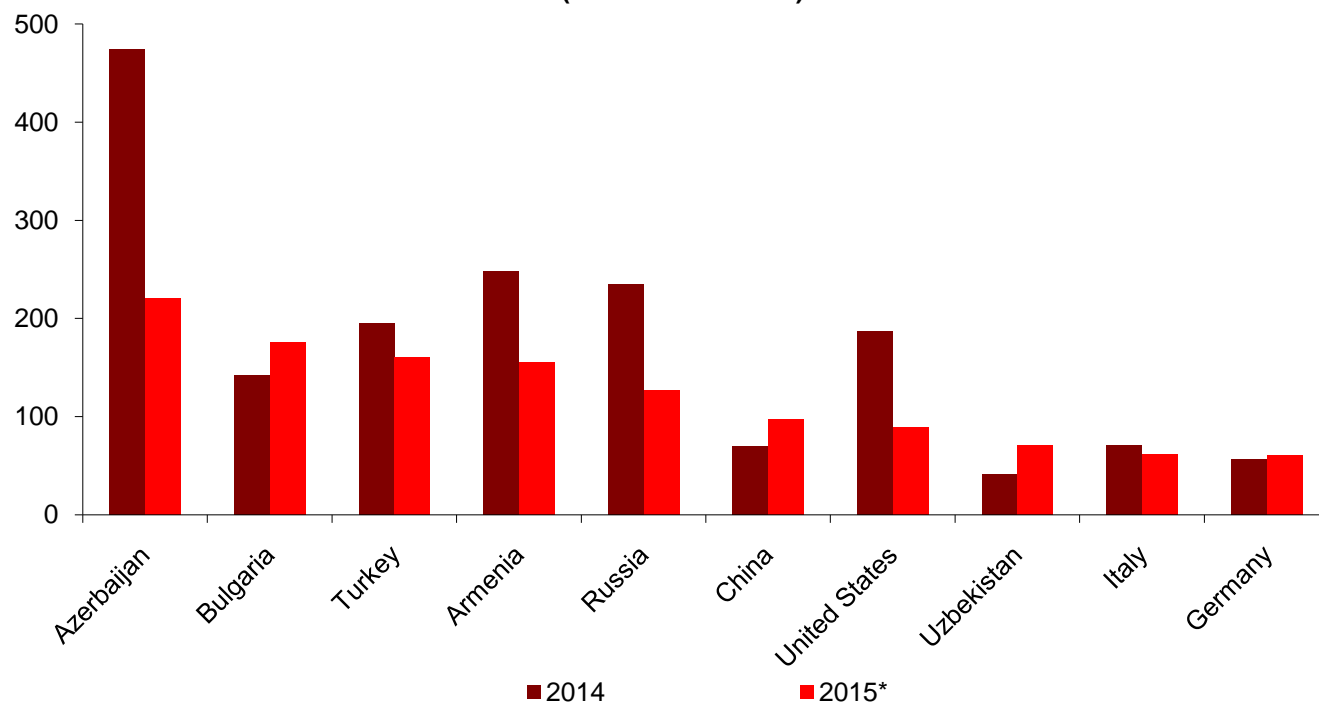

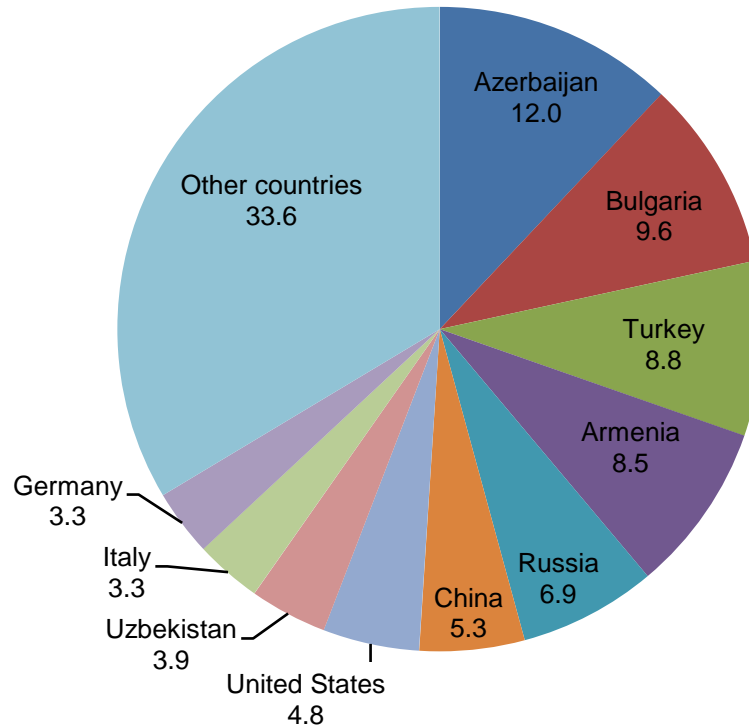

Share of the top trading partners in total exports in January-October 2015\* (%)



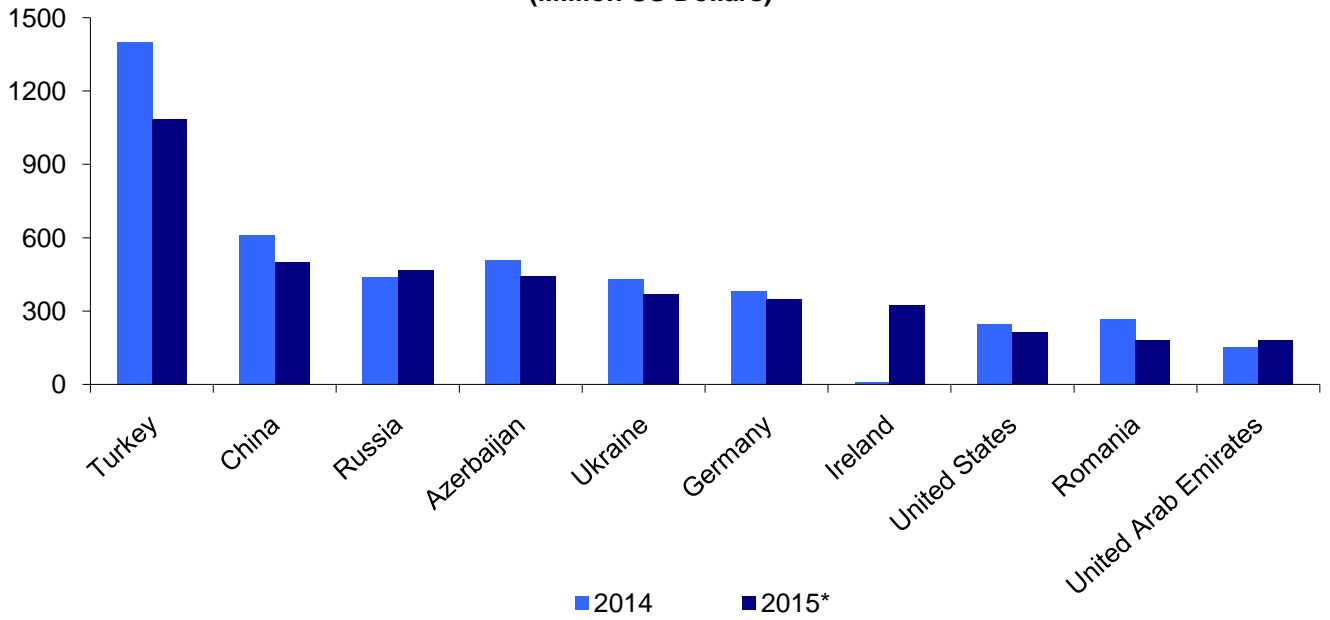

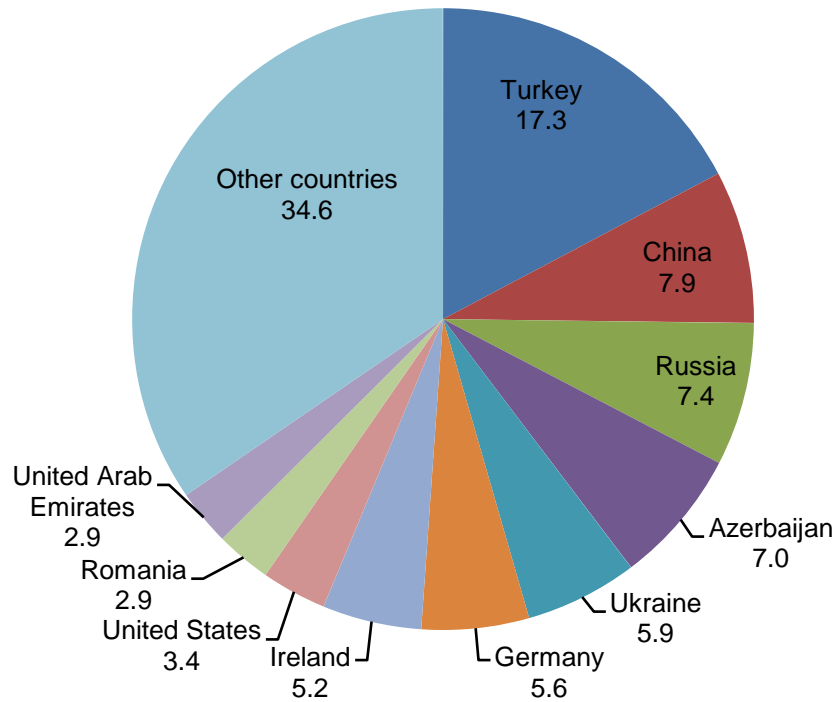

## Major commodity groups by exports and imports

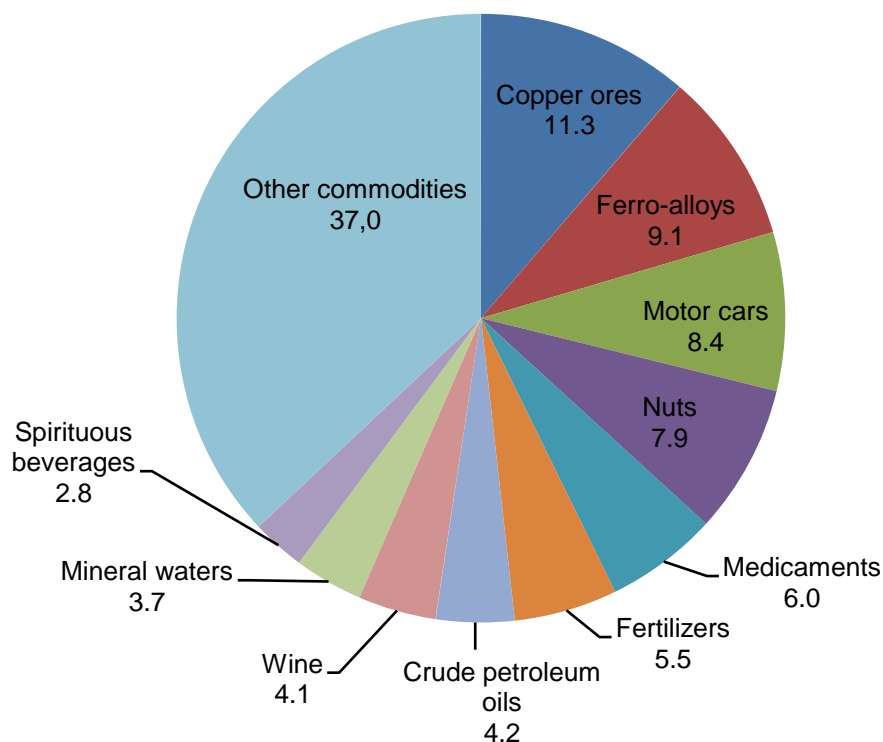
In January-October 2015 Copper ores and concentrates reclaimed the first place in the list of top export items, equaling USD 207 million, or 11 percent of total exports. Exports of Ferro-alloys totaled USD 167 million, and its share in the total exports amounted to 9 percent. Motor cars occupied the third place. Exports of this commodity group stood at USD 154 million and 8 percent of the total exports.

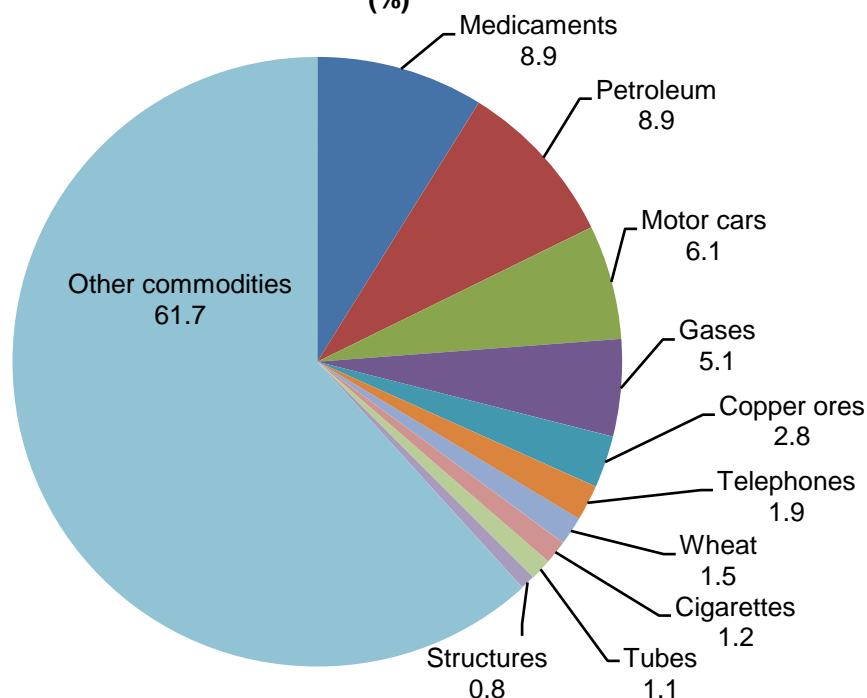
The top import commodity in January-October 2015 was Petroleum and petroleum oils, imports of which amounted to USD 558 million and 9 percent of the total imports. Medicaments commodity group followed in the list with also USD 558 million, or 9 percent of imports. Motor cars came third with USD 381 million (6 percent of imports).

  4. According to the international methodology, there are some difference in coverage of trade flows between external merchandise trade statistics and customs statistics. Diplomatic, temporary, transit and analogous goods are excluded from the database of external merchandise trade statistics.
